He is a retired division commander from the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office and began his law enforcement career at the Indiana University Police Department in Bloomington in May of 1976.

Chief Jowitt has a Master of Science in Criminal Justice and Public Safety and a Bachelor of Science in Business from Indiana University and has completed many professional development courses including sessions offered by the Southern Police Institute, Michigan State University, and the 71st session of the FBI's Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar.
