Patrick Flannelly serves as Chief of Police at the Lafayette Police Department, a role he has held since 2012. Prior to that he served as a Lieutenant from 2005 to 2012, during which time he served as the commander for the Tippecanoe County Drug Task Force. Chief Flannelly was a member of the SWAT team for twelve years, serving as the SWAT Commander from 2005 to 2008. During his 21-year tenure at the Lafayette Police Department, Flannelly also worked as a Community Outreach Officer, Patrol Lieutenant, Patrol Sergeant, among other roles.

Chief Flannelly earned his B.A. in Law & Society from Purdue University. He is a veteran, having served as a Security Police Officer for four years in the United States Air Force. Chief Flannelly is a graduate of the Northwestern University School of Police Staff & Command and in 2014 he completed the Senior Executives in State and Local Government Program at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.

In his personal time Chief Flannelly is very engaged in community. He currently serves on several community advisory boards, youth athletic league boards, and is the Past President of the Board of Directors for the Parks Department for the City of West Lafayette. Chief Flannelly and his wife Kristin have three boys. They are the owners of a local business, CrossFit West Lafayette, and enjoy competing in master level competitions.
