Chief Kevin Jowitt Recognized by Governor Eric Holcomb

Carmel, IN (February 6, 2018) — President Jason Domkowski of the West Lafayette Police Department is pleased to announce that Chief Kevin Jowitt of the Noblesville Police Department was awarded the Governor's Distinguished Hoosier Award at the 2018 Indiana Association of Chiefs of Police Mid-Winter Conference which took place January 24 - 26, 2018 in Indianapolis.

The Distinguished Hoosier Award is one of the highest honors that the Governor of Indiana bestows. It is a personal tribute given to those who have rendered a distinguished service to the state.

Prior to his appointment in Noblesville in May of 2009, Kevin Jowitt served as chief of the Westfield, Indiana Police Department. He is a retired division commander from the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office and began his law enforcement career at the Indiana University Police Department in Bloomington in May of 1976.

Chief Jowitt has a Master of Science in Criminal Justice and Public Safety and a Bachelor of Science in Business from Indiana University and has completed many professional

development courses including sessions offered by the Southern Police Institute, Michigan State University, and the 71st session of the FBI's Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar.

Kevin Jowitt is Immediate Past President of the Indiana Association of Chiefs of Police and a member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the Police Executive Research Forum, the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Association, and the Fraternal Order of Police. He is also a member of Sigma Nu Fraternity and Phi Eta Sigma, Golden Key, and Alpha Phi Sigma academic honoraria's and serves on the Distinguished Alumni Council of the Indiana University School of Public and Environmental Affairs.
