Chief Brett Sprinkle of Newburgh is Awarded the William Sudbury Memorial Leadership Award

Indianapolis, IN (February 4, 2016) —The Indiana Association of Chiefs of Police Foundation (IACPF) held their annual awards ceremony and Police Executive Leadership Academy (PELA) graduation last month during the IACP Mid-Winter Conference. Among the honorees, was Chief Brett Sprinkle of the Newburgh Police Department, winner of the 2016 William Sudbury Memorial Leadership Award.

Indiana has a wealth of law enforcement professionals who go above and beyond the call of duty in pursuit of excellence. The IACP holds an annual awards ceremony in conjunction with the Mid-Winter Conference, to honor and promote excellence within the Indiana Law Enforcement community.

The criteria for the recipient of this award includes demonstrating an awareness of the need for continuous learning, exhibiting commitment and courage to change things necessary to enhance leadership and organizational effectiveness, consistently modeling true leadership, and promoting personal and organizational accountability toward achieving a clear organizational mission.

Chief Brett E. Sprinkle has served in law enforcement for the past 26 years. On January 1, 2005, Sprinkle was appointed Chief of Police of Newburgh Police Department.

Chief Sprinkle is a graduate of the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy, a graduate of the FBI National Academy Class 219, a graduate of two Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Clandestine Lab schools, a Firearms Instructor, a certified Advanced Computer Voice Stress Analyzer (CVSA) Operator, and a certified D.A.R.E. Instructor
